HISTORY

The Fellowship Form was founded in December, 1950, by Paul E. Stinchfield and J. Graeff Kennedy, two friends who invited others to join them in creating a group whose purposes were simply to enjoy each other's company at a weekly luncheon and to benefit from discussion of matters of general interest.

The concept proved popular and as the size of the group increased it was felt that a more formal organization was needed, that basic policies should be formulated and the membership limited in number. This ultimately led to the adoption of a set of rules and regulations, last amended in February, 1971, under which the Forum now functions. Active membership is limited to 50. Officers are elected by the membership at large and serve a one-year term. The Program Director is elected, chairmen of the other committees are appointed by the President, and committee members are selected in consultation between the President and the chairman of the committee concerned.

At the weekly luncheon meetings subjects of a broad range of interests are presented by members or guest speakers, as the record indicates. Although partisan politics and denominational religion are prohibited subjects, members or guest speakers addressing the Forum are otherwise unrestricted in the expression of their views, it being understood that such expression is always "off he record". With the speaker's consent, a short period at the end of each program is customarily devoted to questions or comments from the Forum members. The Forum is justifiably proud of the calibre of speakers it has been able to secure and of the topics discussed, which display a wide range of intellectual and scientific interests and of a depth of business experience.

A complete history of the Fellowship Forum, its origin, development and activities, together with biographical data on members, is kept by the Archivist.

Guests of members are always welcome, except at meetings restricted to the discussion of Forum affairs.
