

INTRODUCTION

The Fellowship Forum was founded in 1950 by Paul E. Stinchfield and J. Graeff Kennedy, two long-time friends who invited others to join them in creating a group whose purposes would be simply to meet at a weekly luncheon and discuss matters of general interest.

It soon became apparent that a formal organization was needed. Accordingly, basic policies were formulated, membership was limited in number, and detailed "Rules and Regulations" were adopted. These evolved over the years into our present By-Laws. In 1987 the Fellowship Forum became a corporation under California law.

Active membership is now limited to fifty-five. Officers are elected each year by vote of the membership.

Members or guest speakers present a broad diversity of subjects, as the Record of Program indicates. Speakers must avoid advocating partisan political positions or denominational religious doctrine. They are otherwise unrestricted in the expression of their views, it being always understood that their remarks are off the record. With their consent, a brief period for questions or comments customarily concludes the meeting.

Guests of members are always welcome, except at meetings restricted to the discussion of Forum affairs.
