PROGRAM

Speaker: Jim Noyes, Research Fellow,

Hoover Institution

Topic: "War and Incompatible Visions:

Iraq, Afghanistan, and Pakistan"

Jim specializes in Middle East Affairs at Hoover, currently researching the regional security implications of a changing military posture in Irag and Afghanistan. He was Deputy Assistant Secretary of Defense for Near Eastern, African and South Asian Affairs (international security affairs) in Washington from 1970 through 1976 during the Nixon administrations. Among his many publications is his volume entitled The Clouded Lens: Persian Gulf Security and U. S. Policy, which has been widely cited for its in-depth analysis of U.S. strategic interests in Southwest Asia. His recent work includes articles published in Newsweek Japan and several public policy digests as well as on-line classes in the Oxford. Yale, Stanford Iraq Forum. He completed a BA at Yale, an MA in Political Science at UC Berkeley, and subsequent studies at Allahabad University in India.

Wives and guests welcome! RAIN ON HIKE DAY CANCELS Henry W. Coe State Park, Santa Clara County

The hike will total about 7.0 miles with an elevation gain of 900 feet. Coe is a park noted for its wildflowers. The trail starts with a climb, then leads through the forest above Coyote Creek, connects to a trail that is well documented to show all of the various trees in the region, and returns through forest and grassland hills.

Take Highway 101 (or 85 & 101 south) toward Morgan Hill and East Dunne Avenue. Go east for 13 miles on Dunne Avenue to the park entrance. Note: The final 13 miles is a long slow drive that winds up the mountains and beyond Anderson Lake (Anderson Reservoir). Driving time will be about one hour and 15 minutes from your house.

Bring a lunch or snack and water.

Layered clothing and hiking boots are recommended.

An extra pair of shoes might be handy after the hike.
