### **PROGRAM**

Speaker: Jim Harbaugh, Head Football Coach

Stanford University

**Topic:** Brief talk followed by Q & A

Jim Harbaugh first came to the Bay Area from Ohio in 1980 when his father, Jack, was named Stanford's defensive coordinator. Jim played quarterback for Palo Alto High School and then went on to play for Bo Schembechler at Michigan. When he left Ann Arbor in 1986 his passing records were among Michigan's all-time top five for attempts, completions, completion percentage, passing yards, and touchdown passes, helping to carry the Wolverines to Fiesta, Holiday, and Rose Bowl appearances. In 1985, Jim led the nation in passing efficiency and led his team to a #2 ranking in the final polls - the highest finish ever for one of Schembechler's Michigan teams. In his senior year Jim earned Big Ten Player of the Year honors, was selected for both the AP and UPI All-American teams, and finished third in Heisman Trophy balloting.

Jim was drafted by the Chicago Bears and played seven seasons for them, passing for a career-high 3,121 yards in 1991. Then he quarterbacked the Indianapolis Colts for four years, leading the team in 1995-1996 to the AFC Championship game and coming within one dropped Hail Mary pass of taking the Colts to the Super Bowl for the first time in 25 years. During that playoff run he earned the nickname "Captain" Comeback" for orchestrating come-from-behind wins over the Chiefs and the Chargers and a near upset over the Steelers. That year he was selected for the Pro Bowl and was named Comeback Player of the Year and AFC Player of the Year. Jim later played for the Baltimore Ravens, San Diego Chargers, and Carolina Panthers before ending his 15-year NFL career in 2001.

Harbaugh spent a year as an assistant coach with the Oakland Raiders in 2002-2003 before being named head coach at the University of San Diego in 2004. His Toreros lost four of their first six games, but then won 27 of the subsequent 29, winning the Pioneer Football League twice. In 2006 Jim was named Head Football Coach at Stanford University, directly across the street from Palo Alto High School where it all started.

The Coach will respond to questions regarding any of the above experiences or perhaps experiences yet to come --- just ask him!

Pacheco State Park, Santa Clara County

The hike will be about 6.5 miles (round trip) with an elevation gain of 900 ft. This is a park noted for its wildflowers. The hike will start with a climb in open grasslands and then go to the top of Spike's Peak. Our return trip will be on a trail that works its way through grassland, hills, and ravines with wildflowers.

Take Highway 101 (or 85 & 101) south toward Gilroy. Go east on Highway 152 to the Pacheco Pass. At the pass look for Dinosaur Point Road just past the truck pullout at the summit. Go right about 900 feet and then turn right into the park. Driving time will be about one hour and 15 minutes from your house.

Bring a lunch or snack and water.

Layered clothing and hiking boots are recommended. An extra pair of shoes might be handy after the hike.

### E-mail addresses in e-TT

It has been pointed out to the Editor that e-mail addresses in online documents can be accessed by internet n'er-do-wells using search engines to generate mailing lists for sending spam and malware. One deterrent (not guaranteed) to such detection is to avoid using the "@" symbol, since that is a common marker used by the "bots" to find e-mail addresses. The alternative notation, replacing the "@" with "(atsign)", is surely less elegant and may be confusing to some readers. As such, it may be a step backward in clarity of communication to Branch 35 members who use e-TT. For that reason, the paper version of Trail Tips will retain the standard format for e-mail addresses.

Wherever "(atsign)" appears in e-TT, it must be replaced with "@" to create a usable e-mail address. Chairmen of the various Branch activities whose addresses appear regularly in Trail Tips will be offered the option of having their e-mail addresses appear in the standard format in e-TT, thus assuming whatever level of risk they perceive would accompany that decision.

A consequence of this situation is that the paper and electronic versions of Trail Tips will not be strictly the same. However, both of them will be published with the same spirit!
