CALL-IN WHEN NOT PLANNING TO ATTEND:

Thanks to all who provided input regarding my message last month about notifying us when you do not plan to attend our luncheon. The Executive Committee is reviewing the comments and determining whether additional steps are appropriate. Unfortunately, I included the monetary loss incurred in May (which was a unique month due to a catering emergency) and left the impression that our lunch count estimating process is out of control and that we often have to pay for those not calling in. This is not the case! We estimate attendance on the basis of our 15+ year old formula that takes into account historical data, reported and unreported absences, guest lists, the judgment of veteran Luncheon Hosts, and a 5% tolerance from the caterer; and normally we do quite well. However, it has long been a problem that 20% of our members do not call to inform us of their planned absences, and again, as in the past, branch leadership is asking for your help. This was the intended message: Please notify us when you do not plan to attend a Luncheon. Thanks for your support.

Wives and guests welcome! RAIN ON HIKE DAY CANCELS Marin Headlands, Golden Gate National Recreation Area, Marin County

The hike will be about 7.5 miles (round trip) with an elevation gain of 1,200 ft. We'll start in a valley for 2 miles and then begin a climb of 1.5 miles. At the summit the trail follows a ridge above Sausalito with views of San Francisco Bay and, further west, the Golden Gate and the Pacific Ocean. After another hill we descend back to the parking area. If we have any energy left, we can visit the new Marine Mammal Center.

Cross the Golden Gate Bridge and take the second exit (the first exit is the vista point). Go left under Highway 101, heading south back toward the Golden Gate Bridge. Then take the first right turn (Conzelman Road) up the hill into the Marin Headlands. Drive for about one mile (passing several vista points on your left) and take the first right turn onto McCullogh Road and follow this down to Bunker Road. Turn left and drive about one mile and turn left at the Information Center sign (near the Youth Hostel). Driving time will be about 70 minutes from your house.

- Bring a lunch or snack and water.
- Restrooms are at the information center.
- Layered clothing (for wind!) and hiking boots are recommended.
