PROGRAM

Speaker: Edward Karpman, M.D. – Urologist

Topic: "Male Sexual Health – Challenges

and Opportunities"

Dr. Karpman is a board certified urologist and one of the few urologists who is also fellowship trained in Male Reproductive Medicine and Surgery, Microsurgery and Male Sexual Dysfunction.

His illustrated talk will cover common problems in men's health: testosterone replacement, erectile dysyfunction, Peyronie's disease, and ejaculatory disorders. To simplify the understanding of the topic, the talk will be organized along with the normal sexual response cycle: excitation, plateau, orgasm, and resolution.

Dr. Karpman established the El Camino Urology Medical Group, Inc., Mountain View. He is a graduate of the University of California, Davis and the University of Vermont medical school, both with honors. He scored in the top 5% of all medical school graduates in the nation on his medical board exams. He also trained at the UC Davis Medical Center (Urologic Surgery) and Baylor College of Medicine (Male Infertility, Microsurgery and Male Sexual Dysfunction). He has received special recognition for his lectures to the graduate class of Human Sexuality at Santa Clara University. He also lectures extensively on testosterone deficiency, testosterone replacement therapy, and penile prosthetic surgery.

We will hike 7.0 miles (round trip) with an elevation gain of 600 ft. The trails are in the redwoods and we will hike along Opal and Blooms Creeks, with a stop at the Sempervirens Falls on our return to headquarters. At this time of year we should see many wild mushrooms along the way. Restrooms are at the trailhead.

Take Highway 9 (Big Basin Way) from the town of Saratoga up to Skyline at Saratoga Gap and then 6 more miles to Highway 236. Take Highway 236 about 12 miles into the Park Headquarters (Caution, this last 12 miles is a narrow and winding road.) Parking is on your right, just beyond the kiosk, as you reach the Headquarters building – meet there. Driving time will be about 60 minutes from your house.
