Speaker: Donna Axelson

Topic: "Matt Axelson, Navy SEAL ---

Warrior and Patriot in Afghanistan"

Matt Axelson was a member of an elite team of Navy SEALs whose extraordinary heroism, ultimate sacrifices, and high honors in the counter-terrorism war in Afghanistan will be the focus of our March Meeting.

From the selection of uniquely qualified and trained individuals, to their deployment and battle challenges, Donna will share the full story of how her son became such a brave member of our special forces in the counter-terrorism battle. She will unfold for us how Matt's "Operation Red Wing" became the deadliest operation in Naval special forces history. This story was initially disclosed in several TV broadcasts and has now been documented in the New York Times best seller, "Lone Survivor" by Marcus Lutrell, one of the members of the SEAL team on the mission with Matt.

Ultimately, Donna and her husband, Corky, spearheaded a movement to establish the Veterans Memorial in Memorial Park to honor all of Cupertino's fallen heroes of war.

Donna has taught in Cupertino schools for 30 years and is currently the Technology Support Teacher for twenty-five schools..

Rectangular Tables

Our experiment with rectangular tables (to save \$400 each month in setup costs) worked even better than we had hoped. Most of those who provided feedback to the Executive Committee said that they actually preferred the rectangular tables because they facilitated conversation with more of their tablemates. Some also commented that the arrangement facilitated movement between tables during the social hour before lunch. We will continue to look for your feedback in the months ahead – the round tables have not disappeared.

In March they will begin to distribute the bi-monthly Travel Bulletin from the Areas 5 & 20 Coordinated Travel Committee with which we are affiliating. Wives and guests welcome! RAIN ON HIKE DAY CANCELS Henry W. Coe State Park, Santa Clara County

The hike will be about 7.0 miles (round trip) with an elevation gain of 900 ft. Coe is a park noted for its wildflowers. The hike will start with a climb, go through the forest above Coyote Creek, and connect to a well-documented trail showing all of the various trees in the region. The return trail works its way through forest and grassland hills.

Take Highway 101 (or 85 & 101) south toward Morgan Hill and East Dunne Avenue. Go east for 13 miles on Dunne Avenue to the park entrance. Note: This 13 miles is a long slow drive which winds up the mountains and beyond Anderson Lake (Anderson Reservoir). Driving time will be about one hour and 15 minutes from your house.

- Bring a lunch or snack and water.
- Layered clothing, hiking boots, and change of shoes are recommended.
- State Park Pass or \$7 fee is required. Carpools are encouraged.
