Table Manners: An old problem has reappeared that threatens two of our key SIR objectives: enjoyment for our members and the making of new friends. Coyote Lake, Harvey Bear Ranch, Santa Clara County

We will hike about 7.0 miles (round trip) with an elevation gain of 700 feet. Our hike will be along a ridge overlooking Coyote Lake on the east and the Coyote Valley on the west. The hike will include climbing several hills in open grasslands and oak forests.
