#### **PROGRAM**

Speaker: Dr. Sean Bushart

Senior Program Manager, Nuclear Sector Electric Power Research Institute (EPRI)

### Topic: "Renewing Our Future: Electricity Roadmap for Meeting Technology Deployment Challenges"

EPRI is a non-profit R&D organization funded by the U.S. and international electric power generating utilities. As such, EPRI is in a unique position to evaluate the "technology roadmap" necessary to cost-effectively meet anticipated restraints on carbon dioxide (CO<sub>2</sub>) emissions, widely recognized as a contributor to greenhouse gas effects and thus global warming potential. EPRI is investigating the electricity generation mix needed to meet possible  $CO_2$  reduction targets of the future. The  $\underline{\text{non-technical}}$  talk will illustrate possible scenarios for our national electricity mix and will review some of the associated technical and economic challenges and opportunities. Aggressive pursuit of a broad portfolio of technology options is identified as a cost effective and technically achievable pathway to meet  $CO_2$  reduction targets.

Dr. Bushart has a distinguished career in a number of areas that bear directly on this subject, including low level waste management, waste minimization technologies, and radiation safety. As a senior member of EPRI, he is an integral part of the planning and management team for its R&D programs, with a broad perspective over the whole range of electricity generation alternatives.

#### Feb. 14-28, 2011 - Magnificent Mediterranean Odyssey

Start with a pre-cruise two-night stay in Venice; then enjoy an eleven-night cruise visiting exotic ports in Italy, Greece, Egypt, Cyprus, Israel, and Croatia. We will hike part of the "Skyline to the Sea Trail" from Saratoga Gap to Waterman Gap (the intersection of Highway 9 and 236). This is a one-way hike of about 6.3 miles with an elevation loss of 1,200 ft. The hike will be through a redwood and oak forest along the Skyline to the Sea Trail, which follows Highway 9. Lunch will be at the Waterman Gap Trail Camp. Please try to ride-share because we will shuttle all hikers and/or drivers back to the Saratoga Gap parking lot at the end of the hike. Bathrooms are available 1 3/4 miles into the hike and at the end of the hike at the trail camp.

Go to the town of Saratoga and take Highway 9 up to the intersection with Skyline Boulevard (Highway 35) and then left into the Vista Point parking lot. Driving time will be about 35 minutes from your house.
