In 1975, Bonnie Bergin originated the concept of "service dogs," dogs trained to help people with mobility limitations. She founded Canine Companions for Independence (CCI) in Santa Rosa, California, to be the provider of such dogs, and later expanded CCI to centers in New York, Ohio, Florida, and southern California. In 1991, she founded the Assistance Dog Institute to educate others on how to train service dogs and how to develop service dog programs, thereby reducing the horrendous 5-10 year wait. The Institute expanded into the world's first university that awards Associate, Bachelor and Master Degrees in dog studies. In appreciation of her work and in recognition of its expanded academic stature, the Institute was re-named the Bergin University of Canine Studies by the Board of Trustees in 2008.



Among her other achievements she helped develop the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) regulations regarding assistance dogs and she began a program whereby teens-at-risk trained animal shelter dogs and later service dogs for people with disabilities. She has also spoken and taught worldwide, published three books, hosted a television series, and received numerous awards for her contributions to the disadvantaged and training of service dogs. THEME TABLES

The "Kickoff" of Theme Tables is planned for the February meeting with at least one table dedicated to vegetable gardening. Other tables will be added as interest develops.

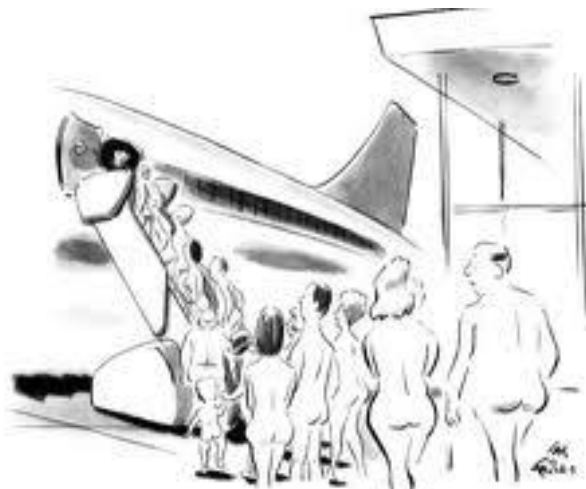
- This Month's Featured SIR Travel -**May 10-17, 2011 Rocky Mountaineer Western Explorer**

Enjoy an 8 day tour of the Canadian Rockies, with one night in Calgary, one night in Banff (Lake Louise), two nights in Jasper and then all aboard the Rocky Mountaineer train, Red Leaf Service, Jasper to Kamloops with an overnight in Kamloops. The train then continues the next day to Vancouver, with an overnight in Vancouver before flying back home. Price is \$2999 pp dbl occ (single occ is \$3626)

July 11 - 23, 2011 (13 days) Denali Explorer Cruise Tour

This trip begins with a flight from San Jose to Anchorage, Alaska where you will arrive at the Captain Cook hotel for a welcome dinner. The following day a scenic motor coach drive takes you to the Princess Lodge at Mt. McKinley (2 nights, 1 dinner). Several day activities are available; a particularly intriguing trip is an all day, ATV (all terrain vehicle), wilderness ride. The Midnight Sun Express (featuring Ultra-dome windows and open platforms) then takes you on to the Denali Princess Wilderness Lodge for two nights, including the "Music at Denali" dinner show the first evening and a full day guided natural history tour into the Denali Wilderness the next day. The following day you will re-board the Midnight Sun Express, traveling to Whittier where you will board the Diamond Princess cruise ship. The 7-night return cruise begins with two days of scenic cruising past Hubbard Glacier and Glacier Bay National Park. The next four days feature stops at Skagway, Juneau, and Ketchikan, followed by a day of cruising through the Inland Passage. You will arrive at Vancouver the final morning in time for the flight home. The costs range from \$3792 pp for an interior cabin to \$4695 pp for a balcony cabin

Hike - The hike will be about 5.0 miles (round trip) with an elevation gain of 700 ft. The hike will start by a creek with a long cascade of many waterfalls. We will then make a loop on a forest trail returning to the parking lot. Bring a lunch or snack and water. Bathrooms are at the parking lot.

Directions - Take Highway 101 (or 85 & 101) south toward Morgan Hill and the Coyote Valley. On Highway 101, take the Baily Road exit south and drive past Santa Teresa Road for a distance of 2.3 miles (up a large hill) to McKean Road. Turn left on McKean Road, which becomes Uvas Road for 6.0 miles. Turn right onto Croy Road and go 4.4 miles (through Sveadal, a private resort). Proceed to the entrance kiosk then to the parking lot 500 feet beyond. Meet at the main parking lot just inside the park. Driving time will be about 50 minutes from your house.

Fees - County Park fee of \$6.00 or a County Park Pass. **Car pools are encouraged.**

Caution - Wear layered clothing appropriate for the weather. Hiking boots are recommended. A change of shoes will help after the hike because the trails may be wet and muddy.
