PROGRAM

Speaker: Richard Lowenthal, Chief Technical Officer of Coulomb **Technologies**

Topic: The Electric Vehicle Industry and Charging Station Requirements.

The speaker will describe new technologies to meet the needs of the emerging electric vehicle industry, including the "ChargePoint Network," which is a smart charging station network developed by Coulomb Technologies. The network makes it easy for drivers using an Internet connection to locate and access public charging stations along their commute route and to track their vehicle's charging performance. Municipalities and businesses are using the network to offer and manage charging services to residents, employees and customers. Electric utilities are using the network to collect data to forecast grid enhancements necessary for electric vehicle programs and services.



Richard Lowenthal co-founded Coulomb Technologies in 2007 and was the CEO from 2007 until 2011. He is currently the Chief Technical Officer. From 1990 through 1995, Mr. Lowenthal was vice president of research and development for StrataCom, a telecommunications equipment company. In 1996, he joined Cisco where he

was a vice president and general manager. He left Cisco in 1997 to focus his energy for 10 years on civic engagements. He subsequently reentered high tech full time in 2007 with the founding of Coulomb Technologies. He has a BS degree in Electrical Engineering from UC Berkeley.

Mr. Lowenthal is also a former Mayor of Cupertino and was named Cupertino's Citizen of the Year in 2008. He has held numerous other civic leadership positions including Cupertino City Councilmember, Chairman of the Santa Clara County Library System, President of Fremont Union High School District Foundation, Board Chairman of the West Valley Community Services and President of The Rotary Club of Cupertino.

The Big Sir Says . . .

Growing Our Membership: We know from the history of many branches in SIR, including our own, that when the focus is taken off of membership growth, membership invariably declines. The reasons are many: members age out, move away, have a change of interests or priorities, develop limits to mobility, etc. Our branch was founded in 1971 and reached a membership of nearly 400 by 1989. It then stayed at that level for four years before starting a long slow decline until 2009. Now, with encouragement from the State, we have again focused on recruiting new members. But how do you do that at the individual member level?

I asked our star recruiter of new members last year, Ken Jones, for his insight. The essence of what he said was as follows:

- · He is always on the lookout for new members among friends retiring from his former company and from networks of his friends, including their wives, etc.
- He looks for matches between a prospect's interests and what SIR can offer, like golfing.
- He enjoys seeing old buddies and being supportive of their acquiring new buddies.
- He usually starts by introducing a prospect to **Damon Simpson** (one of our "Greeters"), who always makes a good first impression!
- He briefs the prospect on all that he thinks is great about SIR and he isn't discouraged if the prospect says "no thanks."
- He is not hesitant about asking new recruits to send him referrals for additional prospects.
- Doing all of this gives him "satisfaction."
- He "really likes our branch and wants to see it do well!"

Growing Our Leadership: An equally critical need for member growth is the identification and development of leadership in the branch, whether for the Executive Committee, our on-going activities or the many special team and task assignments that occur throughout the year. To significantly upgrade our master database of member information with the names of those who have already served in some capacity and those who might be willing to serve in some way in the future, we will soon gather that information from all members via an on-line information request. Results from the information gathered will initially be used by the Nominating Committee, chaired by Dick Wilson with assistance from Vern Schmidt and Don Cameron - all Executive Committee Directors.

<u>Location</u> - Henry W. Coe State Park, Santa Clara County - Meet at the main parking lot just inside the park.

<u>Hike</u> - The hike will be about 7.0 miles (round trip) with an elevation gain of 900 ft. Coe is a park noted for its wildflowers. Our path will start with a climb to a trail through the forest above Coyote Creek. It then connects to a trail that is well documented to show all of the various trees in the region.
