PROGRAM

<u>Speaker</u> - Henry S. Rowen, Senior Fellow, Hoover Institution. <u>Topic</u> - What's Wrong with California? Can it be Fixed?

Henry Rowen's present title does not begin to describe the depth and variety of his diverse roles during a long and distinguished career of service to the nation and to higher education. Hitting only the highlights; he has been president of the RAND Corporation, Chairman of the National Intelligence Council, Assistant Secretary of Defense for International Security Affairs, and a member of the Presidential Commission on the Intelligence of the United States Regarding Weapons of Mass Destruction.



Dr. Rowen began his Stanford years as a professor of Public Policy and Management at the Graduate School of Business. He then went on to codirect the Stanford Program on Regions of Innovation and Entrepreneurship, where he furthered his understanding of innovation in leading regions around the world, with an emphasis on Asia.

Dr. Rowen's published views include a piece in the *Wall Street Journal*, *July 2009* entitled "A New York Solution For Bailing Out California," and he co-edited several books including: "MAKING IT: The Rise of Asia in Information Technologies (2007)" and "The Silicon Valley Edge: A Habitat for Innovation and Entrepreneurship. (2000)"

Dr. Rowen will put the question "What's Wrong with California?" in historical perspective along with some recent initiatives intended to improve things. Given his wide background, his teachings, and his writings over the years, he is clearly very well suited to his topic and to his audience. Bring your curiosity and your questions about the future of our home state.


