PROGRAM**Speaker - Henry S. Rowen, Senior Fellow, Hoover Institution.****Topic - What's Wrong with California? Can it be Fixed?**

Henry Rowen's present title does not begin to describe the depth and variety of his diverse roles during a long and distinguished career of service to the nation and to higher education. Hitting only the highlights; he has been president of the RAND Corporation, Chairman of the National Intelligence Council, Assistant Secretary of Defense for International Security Affairs, and a member of the Presidential Commission on the Intelligence of the United States Regarding Weapons of Mass Destruction.



Dr. Rowen began his Stanford years as a professor of Public Policy and Management at the Graduate School of Business. He then went on to co-direct the Stanford Program on Regions of Innovation and Entrepreneurship, where he furthered his understanding of innovation in leading regions around the world, with an emphasis on Asia.

Dr. Rowen's published views include a piece in the *Wall Street Journal*, July 2009 entitled "A New York Solution For Bailing Out California," and he co-edited several books including: "MAKING IT: The Rise of Asia in Information Technologies (2007)" and "The Silicon Valley Edge: A Habitat for Innovation and Entrepreneurship. (2000)"

Dr. Rowen will put the question "What's Wrong with California?" in historical perspective along with some recent initiatives intended to improve things. Given his wide background, his teachings, and his writings over the years, he is clearly very well suited to his topic and to his audience. Bring your curiosity and your questions about the future of our home state.

Ride - We will ride the Coyote Creek Trail starting from the Holiday Inn San Jose/Silicon Valley. The ride will be about 6 miles to the Coyote Creek Golf Course. We will go another 3 miles beyond the golf course to a model airplane launching site and then double back to the golf course club house for lunch. After lunch we will ride back to the Holiday Inn for a total of 18 flat miles, round trip. For those who want a shorter ride, they may omit the ride to the airplane site, thus reducing the round trip to 12 miles.

Directions - The Holiday Inn is located south of San Jose, one block east of Highway 101 and just north of the Highway 101/ 85 interchange. The directions are the same whether coming on Highway 101 or 85. Take the Bernal Rd. exit. Turn left on Bernal Rd., which becomes Silicon Valley Blvd. after crossing under 101. Location - Almaden Quicksilver County Park, Santa Clara - Meet at the Hacienda Park Entrance.

Hike - The hike will be about 6.0 miles (round trip) with an elevation gain of 900 ft. We start up a dirt road into the area of the old quicksilver mines. We will stop at an old mine shaft as we near the top. We then hike along a ridge with a wide vista of the local hills and parts of south San Jose. Our return trip will bring us back through the heart of the mining area with some evidence of the old mining operations. Bring a lunch or snack and water. Bathrooms are at the parking lot.
