PROGRAM

<u>Speaker</u> – Robert Goodwin, Docent Aboard the USS Hornet Museum and Gartner Managing Vice President.

 $\underline{\text{Topic}}$ - The Role of the USS Hornet in Major Events of the Twentieth Century.

Mr. Goodwin will describe the history of the USS Hornet during its active service, 1943-1970, and its vital role in two of the major events of the Twentieth Century; WW II and the Apollo Moon Landings. He will highlight the Hornet's significant contributions to these events, the remarkable complexity and precision of the tightly integrated and high-risk aircraft carrier operations, and the considerable responsibilities carried out at sea by a very young crew.



Mr. Goodwin saw active duty in the US Navy as an OCS commissioned line officer in 1958-61. He spent two years as a Gunnery Department officer and as Officer of the Deck while underway aboard the aircraft carrier USS Hancock, which was based in Alameda and is the same Essex Carrier class as

the USS Hornet. He also served one year on the Antisubmarine Warfare Operations Staff in Hawaii, working for the legendary aviator, Vice Admiral John Thach.

Mr. Goodwin is presently a Gartner Managing Vice President and Group/Team Manager, leading three Gartner research practices: Industry Market Strategies, Small and Midsize Business, and Software Markets. He holds a BA in Psychology from Occidental College.

<u>Location</u> - Ranch Canada del Oro Open Space Preserve, Santa Clara County. Meet in the parking lot (on the left) near the end of Casa Loma Road

<u>Driving Directions</u> - Take Highway 85 and/or 101 south into the Coyote Valley area of San Jose. Go to the Bailey Avenue exit on Highway 101 and go right (west). Drive 3.3 miles west on Bailey Avenue up the hill to the McKean Road "T" intersection. Make a left turn and drive 2.4 miles south to Casa Loma Road. Turn right and go west to the trailhead near the end of the public road. Driving time will be about 45 minutes from your house.

<u>Hike</u> - The hike will be about 7.0 miles (round trip) with an elevation gain of 1,000 ft. The hike starts in a valley and soon begins a climb of 2.5 miles through oak forests.
