Speaker - Dr. Robert Booth, CEO, Virobay, Inc.

## <u>Topic</u> - Human DNA - The Molecule That Determines Much of Our Life and Destiny

Dr. Booth will describe how DNA functions and its role in allowing life to continue. Although the double helix structure of DNA has been known for more than 50 years, the specific sequence of DNA was only discovered about 5 years ago. Since that time, a wide range of discoveries have been made that allow us to understand what makes humans human and also provides us with insights into the causes of a number of diseases. As a result of these discoveries, a number of new diagnostics have emerged and a number of new therapies have been developed. Despite these great advances, there are still many mysteries which surround the role of DNA, and its functions appear to be much more complicated than anyone imagined.



Since May 2010, Dr. Booth has been the CEO of Virobay, Inc., a company he founded in 2006. Virobay seeks to to develop new therapies for the treatment of pain and autoimmune diseases.

Dr. Booth is also a member of the Board of Directors of Pharmacyclics, a company developing novel therapeutics for oncology. In addition, he is a board observer at Galleon Pharmaceuticals, Chairman of

Galleon's Science Advisory Board and a member of the Scientific Advisory Boards of ShangPharma, a contract research organization in China, and of Elcelyx, a company focused on diabetes and obesity.

Robert Booth received his Ph.D. and B.Sc. from the University of London in the field of biochemistry.

## The Big Sir Says . . .

How We Select and Secure our Speakers - We know from the experience of our own branch and that of others, that the monthly luncheon speaker is a key factor in attracting and retaining members. But how do we get such good ones and offer only a bottle of wine to show our gratitude? We have the following process that seems to work for us:

In the fall, the Little Sir and Little Sir-elect (this year, Co-Little Sirs-elect) solicit various members' interest in serving on the Speaker Program Planning Team for the upcoming year. Some members volunteer because of their interest in particular programs, subjects or speakers. This year, the planning meeting will take place Nov. 5.

From a group discussion of those preferred subjects that provide balance, current interests of members, issues of major impact/importance and potential for finding a top speaker on the subject, the team narrows its selections to a manageable listing of 15 or so topics.

The next critical step is to identify prospective speakers for each of the selected subject areas. Some speakers have already been suggested to us earlier by members. Others surface as we ask who would be the best presenter on the subject and how can that person be secured. We are particularly interested in having our prospective speakers screened by a Sir before choosing them to speak to us. Usually the planning team members take on one or two speaker prospects with the objective of making contact and asking for their willingness to talk to our group of retired/semiretired professionals from many of the major companies and organizations of Silicon Valley. As a result, our audience is attractive to most prospective speakers.

From here on, the process involves getting the speaker's commitment, selecting and coordinating the date, making the arrangements and publicizing the upcoming presentation. In the last eighteen months, we have moved to a shared handling of this responsibility in which the Little Sir and the Program Director for a particular month's program take care of the details to insure that all will happen as required.
