#### **PROGRAM**

<u>Speaker</u> - Dr. Dharmendra S. Modha, Manager, Cognitive Computing, IBM Research - Almaden

**Topic** - Brain on a Chip

Dr. Modha will describe how IBM's so-called cognitive computing chips could one day simulate and emulate the brain's ability to sense, perceive, interact and recognize tasks that humans currently do much better than computers. In a sharp departure from the past, IBM intends to change the computer from a basic calculator to something much more like the brain.



Dr. Modha is the founder of the Cognitive Computing group at IBM Research-Almaden and the principal investigator for the DARPA SyNAPSE team. (SyNAPSE is a backronym for "Systems of Neuromorphic Adaptive Plastic Scalable Electronics.") In this role, he leads a global team across the fields of

neuroscience, nanoscience and supercomputing to build a computing system that will emulate the brain's *abidities* for perception, action, and cognition.

Among the past accomplishments of his group: they have performed cortical simulations at the scale of a cat cerebral cortex (one billion neurons, 10 trillion synapses); they have compiled, visualized, and analyzed the largest network of a Macaque monkey brain currently in existence; and they have recently demonstrated two path-breaking neurosynaptic cores that enable the creation of super-dense, cognitive computing chips.

Dr. Modha holds a Bachelor of Technology degree in Computer Science and Engineering from the Indian Institute of Technology Bombay and a Ph.D. in Electrical and Computer Engineering from the University of California at San Diego. He has 30 U.S. patents, and is named as an IBM Master Inventor. In 2010, he was elected to the IBM Academy of Technology.

# NEW MEMBER RECRUITMENT IS SUCCESSFUL. BRANCHS ARE IMPROVING

Our goal in 2011 was to recruit 1,900 new members. Branch leaders exceeded this goal by recruiting and inducting 2,100 new members. This is an outstanding accomplishment which puts to rest the idea that newly retired men are not joiners. They will join SIR branches that are appealing. But this successful year is only a start.

The SIR organization fell on hard times in recent years. Overall membership declined from about 32,000 members in 1990 to about 18,000 now. In the last 12 years, 44 branches have failed and closed. We know why this happened. We lost our focus on maintaining a good balance of newer and older members in our branches. We did not recruit enough new members annually to maintain a good proportion of newer members and so our branches became less appealing and lost members.

Our challenge now is to restore this balance. We have found that we need to recruit new members every year at the annual rate of at least 10% of the current membership. In 2011 we met and exceeded this goal. So when Branch leaders remind you to sponsor a new member, please respond by inviting your retired friends and acquaintances to join. Each successive year this goal is met, the proportion of newer members in your branch will increase. Over time, balance will be restored and your improved branch will be there for you and for those who come after you.
