#### **PROGRAM**

<u>Speaker</u> - John Mascali, U.S. Navy Reserve Officer and Commercial Airline Pilot (Retired).

#### **Topic** - The History of Moffett Field

John Mascali is a retired Navy Captain with over 41 years of flying experience. He started flying in 1959 after graduating from the U.S. Naval Academy, and ended his career in 2000, retiring as a commercial pilot with Pan American World Airways and Delta Airlines. He credits his long career to the adage that "there are bold pilots and there are old pilots, but there are no old, bold pilots." His career in the Navy extended over 35 years and included tours of duty at Moffett Field Naval Air Station in Patrol Squadrons VP-19, VP-31 and as the Commanding Officer of VP 2920, VP 91 and VTU 8087.



John has lived in Saratoga for 42 years with his wife Diana, to whom he's been married for over 50 years. He currently serves on the Moffett Field Historical Society's Board as Director of Development. He is also a member of the Navy League, Sons of the American Revolution, The Quiet Birdman and several other local organizations.

In his presentation "The History of Moffett Field," John will trace the 75-year history from its beginning in 1930 when Mrs. Laura Whipple of Niles lead a campaign to purchase more than 1000 acres of farmland in Sunnyvale and Mountain View for \$476,000, then sold it to the Navy for \$1. John will share pictures and stories of the construction of Hangar One, the rigid dirigible USS Macon, the many different squadrons and aircraft that have flown out of Moffett Field, and some of the history of NASA Ames.

#### A Special Tribute to George Fullmer

George Fullmer passed away on Sunday, February 5, 2012. For the past 25 years he has amused us—and bemused our speakers—with song parodies that have always brought a smile, often a laugh, and the occasional burst of applause.

George joined SIR Branch 35 in July of 1986, and only a year later began his long run as our parody writer. The previous writer, the widow of Emmet Fitzpatrick, who founded Trail Birds when Branch 35 was created in 1971, had passed away — and George stepped in. (You may remember that Emmet composed both words and music for "If I Had My Life to Live Over, I'd Live Over the Corner Saloon," plus many other copyrighted songs.)

About a year ago, at the suggestion of then Big Sir Ken Newton, George happily began sharing his pen with Duncan MacVicar and Bob Simon, with each man writing about three parodies a year (George's last parody was in January of this year.)

Branch 35 made George an Honorary Life Member (HLM) over 10 years ago; he was recently made a Senior Honorary Life Member. The HLM was our recognition of a man who singlehandedly and behind-the-scenes lifted the spirits of the Branch month after month and year after year. After a rewarding career at General Electric, he "lived his life over" as our balladeer extraordinaire, and we have been the beneficiaries of his wit and wisdom. George, we will miss you!

<u>Ride</u> - We will begin the ride at the Coyote Hills Park and continue on the Alameda Trail to Niles, where we will have lunch at a restaurant in downtown Niles. The ride is flat and approximately 9 miles each way, with an optional loop that has a scenic view of the bay and adds about one mile, for a total ride of 19 miles.

<u>Directions</u> - Take Highway 84 across the Dumbarton Bridge past the toll booth to the first exit, which is Paseo Padre Parkway. Turn left and go one mile to Paterson Ranch Road and turn left. <u>Location</u> - McNee Ranch - Montara State Beach, Montara, CA - Meet at the north end of Montara State Beach (about 1/2 mile north of the Outrigger Restaurant (the former Chart House Restaurant).

<u>Directions</u> - Take Highway 1 north of Half Moon Bay to the town of Montara. Look for the Outrigger Restaurant on your left (ocean side) and for signs for Montara Beach State Park. Continue along Highway 1 to the north end of the park (about 1/3 mile) and park in the lot on the left just off the highway, where we will meet. We will walk north from the parking area and across the highway into the old ranch entrance. Driving time will be about 50 minutes from your house. **Car pools are encouraged.** 

Hike - The hike will be about 6.5 miles round trip, up the Old Pedro Mountain Road, with an elevation gain of 900 ft.
