PROGRAM

Speaker: Roy Lave, Founder and Former Chair/CEO, Los Altos Community Foundation and Former Mayor of Los Altos.

Topic: Volunteerism

Over the last 20 years, Dr. Lave has served as the Founding Chair/CEO of the Los Altos Community Foundation. He also served as Los Altos Mayor and Councilmember, and as a Commissioner on both the Metropolitan and Santa Clara County Transportation Commissions. He now serves on the board of directors of the Bus Barn Stage Company Theatre, the Los Altos Rotary AIDS Project and has recently retired from the Moscow-Santa Clara County Sister-County Commission.



Prior to his retirement, Dr. Lave was the CEO and Co-Founder of SYSTAN Corporation, a systems analysis consulting firm. In addition, he served as a founding Director of the Bank of Los Altos and, in 2000, joined the Heritage Bank of Commerce where he served until 2005.

Dr. Lave is an expert in follow-on careers and volunteerism. He will address the new recognition by sociologists of a demographic of seniors who are retired but still healthy, active and fully capable of continuing to contribute for two or more decades longer than in previous generations. Nothing in our personal backgrounds, our various cultures or our society has prepared us for this time in our lives. Many of the seniors in this group may have special abilities of value to our community, together with needs for enrichment and engagement beyond the present offerings for seniors.

Dr. Lave earned BS, MS and MBA degrees from the University of Michigan and a PhD from Stanford University in Operations Research and Industrial Engineering. He has lived in Los Altos with his spouse Penny (also a previous Los Altos Mayor) for over 43 years.

Location: Bay Trail from Mountain View to Alviso

The Ride: We will begin the ride at the La Avenida Trial Head at end of La Avenida Street, Mtn. View, and follow the Stevens Creek Trail for 1.5 miles to its connection with the Bay Trail. We then continue the ride 3.5 miles on the levees and old service roads as we cross the waters north of Moffett Field. (Note: This portion of the Bay Trail has a packed gravel surface and is bumpy in places) We will then head for Sunnyvale Baylands Park where we will follow the trial through the park and then to downtown Alviso. There, we will have lunch at a restaurant. The ride is 9.5 miles one way. We will return on the same route for a roundtrip of 19 miles. There are no optional shortcuts.

Directions: From the intersection of Hwy 101 and Shoreline Blvd., head north on North Shoreline Blvd. toward the Computer History Museum. La Avenida is the first street on the right, but it is one-way so you can't turn there. Instead, go past the Computer History Museum to Pear Ave and turn right. Turn right again at Ingo Way and follow it back to La Avenida Street. Then turn left. (It is two-way here) and go to the end of the street. Park on the street, next to the curb.
