RAIN CANCELS

Location: Fall Creek - Henry Cowell Redwoods State Park, Felton, CA - Santa Cruz County. Meet at the Felton-Empire Road parking lot.

Directions: Take Highway 17 south to Mt. Herman Road. Follow Mt. Herman road through the town of Scotts Valley and about 3 miles to the "T" intersection with Graham Hill Road in Felton. Turn right and go one block to a traffic light with Highway 9. Cross Highway 9, where the road turns into Felton-Empire Road, and continue about 3/4 mile to the Falls Creek parking lot on the right. Driving time will be about 50 minutes from your house.

The Hike: The hike will be about 6.8 miles (round trip) with an elevation gain of 1,100 ft. It will begin along Fall Creek, pass through a redwood forest to an old limestone kiln, and then back to Fall Creek. We will go by an old barrel mill as we continue up the creek, followed by a steep climb (0.4 mile) up to a fire road. The return trip is downhill through redwood forests and back to the creek trail. This hike should pass wildflowers and lots of waterfalls.

Bathrooms: There are no bathrooms at the Fall Creek trailhead. However, there are some at the Felton City Park located at the "T" intersection of Mt. Herman Road and Graham Hill Roads – OR – you can use the restrooms at the Chevron gas station located at Graham Hill Rd and Highway 9. Also, there are toilets at Henry Cowell State Park located 1/2 mile (left) down Highway 9

Fees: No fees required.

Lunch: Bring a lunch or snack and water.

Caution: Wear layered clothing appropriate for the weather. Hiking boots are recommended. **Also note:** The moist redwood forest will have some mosquitoes so bring your bug repellent.

Location: Coyote Creek Trail (South San Jose)

The Ride: We will follow the Coyote Creek Trail starting from the Holiday Inn at 399 Silicon Valley Rd., San Jose. The first leg of ride will be about 6 miles to the Coyote Creek Golf Course. We will go past the golf course another 3 miles to a model airplane launching site, then double back to the golf course club house for lunch. 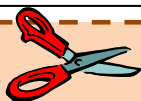
