Speaker: Jim Schlatter, SIR 35 Golfer

Topic: "A Day at the Masters"

The Masters is the one golf tournament that most professional golfers yearn to play and most golf spectators yearn to attend. Its hallowed traditions for both participants and spectators are unique among all professional sports, not only golf. Jim has attended the Masters twice. He will describe how a day unfolds for someone fortunate enough to secure an admission ticket to the tournament course. No matter whether you play golf or not, know a shaft from a shank, or can understand why someone could possibly want to wander around all day watching golfers, you can be entertained by a day at the Masters. Jim will tell you how.



Jim started playing golf at age 12 in Madison, Wisconsin. Then he set aside his golf clubs to earn a PhD in Chemical Engineering at Stanford followed by 32 years of gainful employment. He retired in

2003, found his golf clubs in the closet where he had left them, and joined SIR Branch 35. Besides golfing with his SIR friends, he serves as Treasurer for SIR 35 Golf and exercises his public speaking skills at its Annual Banquet. Jim also edited Trail Tips for two years along the way. His golf swing of his youth still eludes him.

<u>Location:</u> Mount Tamalpais State Park, Marin County - Meet at the Pantoll Ranger Station Trailhead parking lot on the Panoramic Highway (this is past the turnoff to Muir Woods).

<u>Directions:</u> Go north on Highway 101 past Sausalito, CA, to the Highway 1 exit. Drive about 3.3 miles on Highway 1, then make a right turn onto the Panoramic Highway. Drive 4.9 miles on the Panoramic Highway past the Muir Woods turnoff to the Pantoll Trailhead (on your left). Driving time will be about 90 minutes. Note: Your return trip home will require a Golden Gate Bridge toll.

<u>Hike:</u> We will hike about 7.5 miles round trip with an elevation gain of 600 feet. The hike begins on the Coastal Trail with a vista of Stinson Beach and the ocean after 2 miles. We then proceed to the Laurel Dell picnic area and Cataract Falls for our lunch. The return hike follows Cataract and Old Mine Trails back to the parking lot with a great vista of the Marin Headlands. Bathrooms are available at the trailhead.

Lunch: Bring a lunch or snack and water.

<u>Fees:</u> A State Park fee of \$10.00 (or Annual Park Pass) for each car and the \$6.00 Golden Gate Bridge toll on your return trip.

<u>Caution:</u> Wear layered clothing appropriate for the weather. Hiking boots are recommended.
