Speaker: Mark Byington, President, Cobalt Power Systems, Inc.

In 2001, Mark decided to step off the treadmill for a year and focus on his three children as a single dad. This didn't last long. In 2003 he founded Cobalt Power Systems and has enjoyed being a part of the solar industry for the past ten years.
