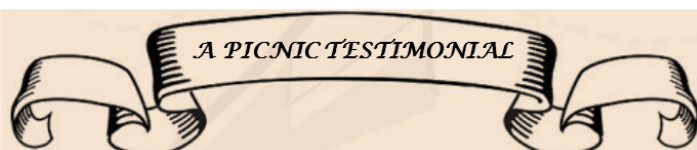

Location: Sam McDonald County Park, San Mateo County

- Meet at the parking lot at the entrance.

Directions: Take California State Route 84 to the town of La Honda, then continue for about one-half mile beyond the town to Pescadero Road and make a left turn at the "T" intersection. Drive 1.1 miles and turn right which continues as Pescadero Road (do not go on Alpine Road). Drive about .75 miles and you will see the park entrance on your right. Driving time will be about 50 minutes from your house.

Hike: We will hike about 5.5 miles (round trip) in the redwoods and some open grassland with an elevation gain of 700 feet. We will visit Heritage Grove of old-growth redwoods and then hike up to a "Hikers' Hut" where we will have lunch. It may be cool weather as we get started but should warm up quickly.

Lunch: Bring a trail lunch or snack and water. Bathrooms are available at the parking area.

Fees: No fees for seniors. Car pools are encouraged.

Caution: Wear layered clothing appropriate for the weather. Hiking boots are recommended.

Location: Coyote Creek Trail – South San Jose

Ride: We will ride the Coyote Creek Trail starting from the former Holiday Inn at 399 Silicon Valley Blvd., San Jose. The ride will be about 6 miles to the Coyote Creek Golf Course. We will go past the golf course another 3 miles to a model airplane launching site, then double back to the golf course club house for lunch. After lunch we will ride back to the Holiday Inn for a total of 18 flat miles, round trip. 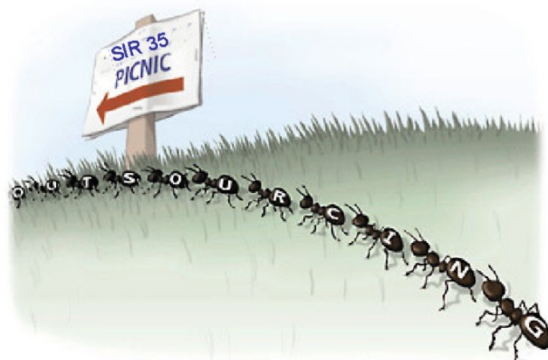

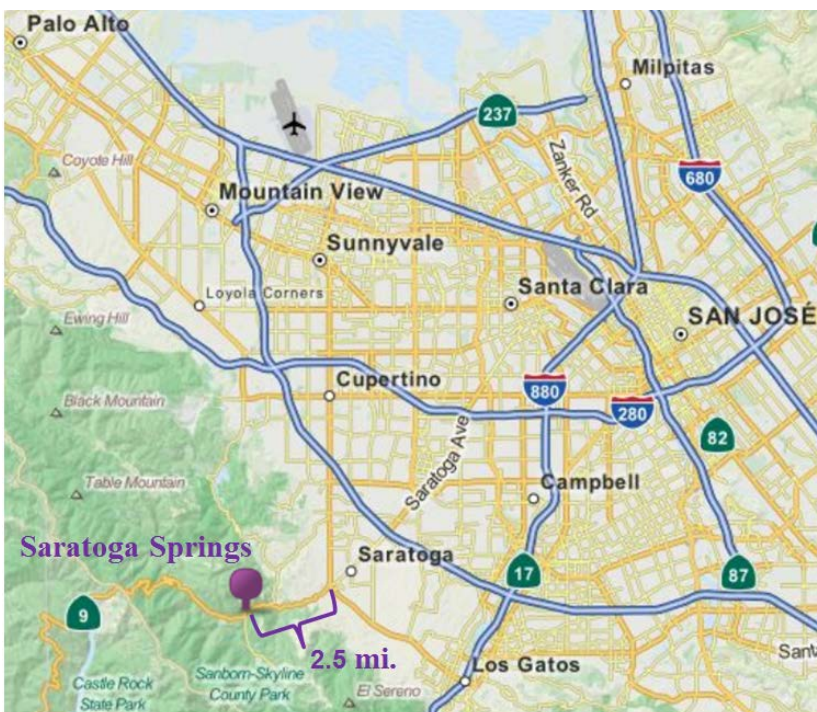
