Topic: Public and Private Long Term Care Alternatives

<u>Location:</u> San Bruno Mountain State & County Park, San Mateo County - Meet at the main parking lot just inside the park.

<u>Directions:</u> Take Highway 101 north of the San Francisco Airport to the Brisbane/Cow Palace exit and drive 1.8 miles on Bayshore Boulevard, heading toward the Cow Palace. Turn left (west) on Guadalupe Canyon Parkway and drive 2.3 miles to the park entrance on your right. The drive should take about 45 minutes.
