Speaker: Nicholas (Nick) Gottuso, 33 Years in Law Enforcement, Retired Senior SWAT Commander

Topic: History of SWAT



SALINAS, Calif. —A 37,000-pound armored truck that was once used by the military in Iraq and Afghanistan will now be used by the Salinas Police Department for SWAT team operations.

We frequently hear of the use of SWAT Teams these days as part of law enforcement. How did these organizations originate? Nick will tell us with a PowerPoint presentation on "The History of SWAT."



Nick retired in June, 2011, as Senior Captain at Hillsborough PD and Senior SWAT and Sniper Team Commander of North Central Regional SWAT, the largest regional SWAT Team in the state. He is currently serving as Adjunct Professor of Administration of Justice at Skyline College.

We had two at the picnic, and due to quick response by one of our members who performed the Heimlich maneuver, we saved a member's life.

I want to thank all of the members who **volunteered** to work hard for Branch 35 during 2013 and those who will be serving us in 2014. I am looking forward to a great year in 2014. Look for some changes in the program and some new activities.
