

<u>Location:</u> Russian Ridge Open Space Preserve – Meet at the main parking lot at Skyline Boulevard (Highway 35) and Page Mill/Alpine Road. <u>Directions:</u> Take Page Mill road up to the intersection with Skyline Blvd. Cross Skyline and go about 300 feet on Alpine Road to the parking lot on your right. Driving time from I-280/Page Mill interchange is about 35 minutes. Carpools are encouraged.

<u>Hike Details</u>: We will hike 5.2 miles round trip with an elevation gain of about 600 feet. The trail goes through open grassland and an old oak forest. We usually see many wildflowers here in April. However, the number and quality this year will depend on recent rains considering the drought we are experiencing. Wear weather-appropriate clothing and hiking shoes. It could be windy on the ridge. On clear days, there are great views of the valley and the ocean. A pit toilet is available at the parking lot.

Also, to Les Fisher who will be assisting me with researching and exploring future hike locations. In the months to come we will try to select hikes that

are of the most interest to the members.
