### **PROGRAM**

Speaker: David Sloss, Professor of Law

<u>Topic:</u> How International Human Rights Transformed the U.S. Constitution

David Sloss is a Professor of Law at Santa Clara University School of Law, where he served as the Director of the Center for Global Law and Policy. He has published numerous articles on the history of U.S. foreign affairs law and the judicial enforcement of treaties in domestic courts. He received his B.A. from Hampshire College, his M.P.P. from Harvard University Kennedy School of Government and his J.D. from Stanford Law School. Before he was a law professor, he spent nine years in the U.S. government, where he worked on East-West arms control negotiations and nuclear proliferation issues.



Professor Sloss is currently working on his new book *The Power of Ideas: International human rights and constitutional tranformations.* While most experts agree that international human rights law has had little impact on the evolution of constitutional law in the U.S., Professor Sloss disagrees. In fact, international human rights norms had a profound impact on the development of constitutional law in the U.S. between about

1945 and 1970. He will describe how in 1950 in *Fujii v. California*, an intermediate appellate court in California ruled in favor of the Japanese plaintiff, holding that California's so-called "Alien Land Law" was invalid because it conflicted with the human rights provisions of the U.N. Charter. The California Supreme Court later agreed that the Alien Land Law was invalid, but based its decision on the Equal Protection Clause of the U.S. Constitution. In effect, the court incorporated the U.N. Charter's anti-discrimination principle into the Equal Protection Clause.
