#### **PROGRAM**

<u>Speaker:</u> Nicole Sandkulla, Chief Executive Officer and General Manager of BAWSCA

<u>Topic:</u> The Bay Area's Interests in the San Francisco Regional Water System: Past, Present and Future

The San Francisco Chronicle reported in January, 2014, that a debate is emerging between the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission (SFPUC) and the Bay Area Water Supply and Conservation Agency (BAWSCA) over the potential disaster if the water system's Mountain Tunnel collapses. That tunnel supplies 2.6 million Bay Area homes and businesses with water. SFPUC has known for 25 years that significant work is needed on the 19-mile-long tunnel just outside Yosemite National Park. But ultimately, the 89-year-old connector was left out of a rebuild project, which focused on upgrading Bay Area water facilities that could fail in an earthquake.



This was just one of the issues facing our speaker, Nicole Sandkulla, when was she BAWSCA's selected to be CEO/GM in July, 2013. Sandkulla, a civil engineering graduate of California Polytechnic State University-San Luis Obispo, joined BAWSCA in 1999 after nine years with East Bay Mud. During her fourteen years as

Water Resources Manager for BAWSCA, she was described as "a results-driven executive." She has a huge job representing the interests of 24 cities and water districts, plus two private utilities, that purchase water wholesale from the San Francisco regional water system. These entities provide water to 1.7 million people, businesses and community organizations in Alameda, Santa Clara and San Mateo counties.

#### Hiking to be scheduled in February
