*****NEW TRIPS****

November 13-25, 2013 ♦ Paris, Rhone River, and **Provence** ◆ (Br 62) Escorts Jim Hohenshelt (408-394-7226) and Roy Jordan (408-735-8765). We are proposing a less expensive version of the Rhone River cruise previously listed. We fly from San Francisco to Nice for an overnight stay and short exploration. The next day a motor coach takes us to Arles, with a stop at the Rhone American (WWII) Cemetery. At Arles, we board the Grand Circle 5 star rated cruise ship "Provence," and after touring Arles, we depart for an 8 day (7 night) cruise of the Rhone and Saone Rivers, with stops, day tours, and free time in Avignon, Viviers, Lyon, and Macon, also with overnight stops in Tournon and Trevoux. After disembarking in Macon, we board a bus for Paris, with a stop and walking tour in Beaune en route. We have three nights in Paris at the Moderate First Class Novotel Paris Eiffel Tower (or similar) hotel. Our stay in Paris includes a panoramic tour, passing by the Champs Elysees, Eiffel Tower, Cathedral of Notre Dame and other landmarks, and a guided tour of Versailles. Another day will feature an optional tour of the Louvre and a half day free. The cost is approximately \$4700 to \$5400 pp/dbl occ. (depending on the cabin category), including air fare, transfers, accommodations, taxes, cruise meals, and breakfasts, Paris and Versailles tours. For those wanting to explore further, there may be an optional three day extension in Paris available for about \$750.

We call at Oslo, Norway with its rich Viking history; Gothenburg, Sweden with cobblestone streets and a wonderful coastline and archipelago; Tallinn, Estonia, remarkably unchanged since 1154 AD; then a two day call in St. Petersburg, Russia, capital of the Tsars and Venice of the North. We continue to Helsinki, Finland, center of Finnish culture and commerce; Stockholm, Sweden, on 14 islands with parks and museums including the 600 room Royal Palace; Copenhagen, Denmark a fairy tale city with coppery green towers, gingerbread houses and cobblestone streets; and Brussels, Belgium whose diverse architecture ranges from medieval to post-modern; returning to Southampton for transfer to our flight home.
